#### World Book Day

We are delighted to share the highlights of our recent World Book Day celebration, which was a fantastic success!

Highlights of the Day:

**Staff Dressing Up:** Our enthusiastic staff dressed up as their favourite book characters, creating a fun and engaging atmosphere that the students loved.

**Finders Keepers Books:** Students had a blast participating in the "Finders Keepers" book hunt. Many books were discovered and taken home by excited students!

**Book Quiz:** The Footy Booky quiz was a hit, with Year 7 students eagerly testing their literary and football knowledge.

### **Science Primary Visit**

In honour of STEM week 2025, we invited some local primary schools to Hodgson to take part in a range of science based activities. Among the schools which came, were Anchorsholme, St Anne's and St Chad's. The students watched Miss Hamilton and Miss Corsby complete some explosive science demonstrations at the front of the hall, and then took part in their own experiments. There were three stations around the hall with three separate experiments.





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One was an egg drop challenge – the students made a device to hold an egg in, which was dropped from the stage. If their egg did not crack, it was a successful device. Another station was a milk rainbow experiment. Students used food colouring and washing up liquid in milk and tried to make a rainbow. The final station was an Alka-Seltzer rocket, where students designed a rocket to stick onto a film cannister, filled the cannister with a seltzer tablet and water, and waited for their rocket to blast off.

Thank you to Dr Thagia for supporting with the organisation of the event and Dr Harrison for sorting out all of the equipment needed for the experiments! We also had a number of our Year 7 and 11 students supporting with this as well.
