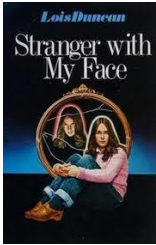


## Miss Hetherington's Recommended Reads!

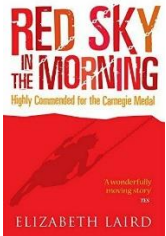
### 'Stranger With My Face' by Lois Duncan

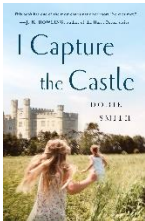
### 'Red Sky in the Morning' by Elizabeth Laird
